A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE KITTERY ROTARY CLUB

Rotary was started in Evanston, Illinois by Paul Harris in 1904. It has grown to an international service organization of over 1.2 million members in over 155 countries.

The Rotary Club of Kittery was founded in October 1987 with 28 members, of which over 30% were women. We have established traditions of community service over the last 10 years. We have a history of giving scholarships to high school graduates, volunteering for Special Olympics, hosting Group Study Exchange team members, donations to Kittery Holiday Baskets, HIV/AIDS awareness and education, CPR Outreach and immunization clinics, Library moving day, support DARE & K-CAP programs, sponsor Career Days at Traip Academy, participating in District projects such as the recent Camp Sunshine work weekend, and many other activities and service projects.

Past Presidents include Russ McMullen, Joyce Crabtree, Marie Williams, Harrison Lemont, Dave Hager, Phil McCarthy, Steve Swallow, Linda Reichler, and Sue Czarnionka. Lezlye Shea is the current president.

The Rotary Club of Kittery is honored to be the home club of the 97-98 District 7780 Governor, Past President, Marie Williams. She is the first woman to serve the District in that position.
