The object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

1. The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service;
2. High ethical standards in business and professions; the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations; and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;
3. The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life;
4. The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

THE ROTARY CLUB OF KITTERY A BRIEF HISTORY

Rotary was started in Evanston, Illinois by Paul Harris in 1904. It has grown to an international service organization of over 1.2 million members in 30,000+ clubs in 163 countries.

The Rotary Club of Kittery was founded in October 1987 with 28 members, of which over 30% were women. We have established traditions of community service over the last 15 years. We have a history of giving scholarships to high school graduates, volunteering for Special Olympics, hosting Group Study Exchange members, participated in Rice Library moving day, donations to Kittery Holiday Baskets, HIV/AIDS awareness and education, support of DARE and K-CAP programs, Project Graduation, Student of the Month Awards, monthly donations of books signed by our speakers and special guests to Kittery school libraries, Frisbee Playground project, Friends Forever, RYLA, Pine Tree Camp, and participating in District projects such as a Camp Sunshine work weekend, and many other activities and service projects. Our international projects have included a Women's Cancer Clinic in India, Disaster Relief Kit, aiding a school for mentally & physically challenged students in So. Africa, and feeding street children in the Philippines.

Past Presidents include Russ McMullen, Joyce Crabtree, Marie Williams, Harrison Lemont, David Hager, Philip McCarthy, Steve Swallow, Linda Reichler, Susan Czarnionka, Lezlye Shea, Thane Pearson, Frank Clark, Bill St. Laurent, and Susan Czarnionka. David Dimmick is the current president.

Former President, Marie Williams, served as the 1st woman District 7780 Governor in the Rotary year 1997-98.
