## A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE KITTERY ROTARY CLUB

Rotary was started in Evanston, Illinois by Paul Harris in 1904. It has grown to an international service organization of over 1.2 million members in over 170 countries.

Kittery Rotary was founded in October 1987 with 28 members, of which over 30% were women. We have established traditions of community service in the first five years, with growing membership. We have a history of giving scholarships to high school graduates, volunteering for Special Olympics, sponsoring youth exchange programs and many diversified activities.

The club presidents who have served include Russ McMullen, Joyce Crabtree, Marie Williams, and Harrison Lemont; the present club president is David Hager.

Honored members include Paul Harris Fellows: David Avery, Carol Grover, Esther Linscott (In memory), Russ McMullen, Dean Smith and Marie Williams. We presently have 7 sustaining Paul Harris contributors.

Our objectives include four principal avenues of service: International, Community, Youth and Club Service. The Board of Directors include Pam Gray, Secretary; Richard Donhauser, Treasurer; Steve Swallow, Club Service; David Avery, Community Service; Marie Williams, International Service; Linda Reichler, Youth and Vocational Service; Tom Pessoney, Sergeant at Arms; Phil McCarthy, President Elect; and Harrison Lemont, past president.

## OBJECT OF ROTARY
